**MEMORANDUM**

**Sub:- Observance of 54<sup>th</sup> National Safety Day/National Safety Week Campaign - commencing from 4<sup>th</sup> March, 2025.**

The 54<sup>th</sup> National Safety Day is going to be observed in factories/industries of Tripura along with the rest of the Country on 4<sup>th</sup> March, 2025 followed by National Safety Week from 4<sup>th</sup> March to 10<sup>th</sup> March 2025.

The week-long campaign on Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) is widely celebrated across Industries, Trade Union, Government Department, Regulatory Agencies, NGOs, institutions with active support from the Central and State Government, as well as the media. The objective of the campaign is to promote the voluntary OSH movement across all sectors and to engage people from all walks of life in the country.

“**Viksit Bharat 2047**” is an initiative aimed at realizing India’s aspiration of becoming a developed nation by its centennial year of independence. This initiative seeks to mobilize efforts across economic, social, environmental, and governance domains to achieve comprehensive and sustainable development. The concept envisions India as a leading global power, with high standards of living, equitable growth, and environmental stewardship. To further this vision, the NSC has decided that the theme for NSD-2025 as:

**“Safety & Well-being Crucial for Viksit Bharat”**

The objective of observance of the National Safety Day and Week is to induce Safety consciousness amongst the workers working in various factories /industries installations so as to ensure prevention of loss of life and properties. Industrial accidents can be effectively reduced by removing unsafe conditions in the factories and motivating the workers and management towards safety. Accident also places a heavy burden upon the society, it is a moral obligation on the part of the management to observe the National Safety Day and Week and to make solemn promises for ensuring Safety and hazard free working conditions in factories.

The Occupier and Manager of all factories shall observe **54<sup>th</sup> National Safety Day** on **4<sup>th</sup> March, 2025** and **National Safety Week** from **4<sup>th</sup> March, 2025 to 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2025** in their factories. In celebration program, Safety Committees of the factories, wherever constituted may be associated.

Following steps may be taken to celebrate the National Safety Day and Week.

- 1) Flex /Banner inscribing the 54<sup>th</sup> National Safety Day and 54<sup>th</sup> National Safety Week may be displayed at the entrance / main gate of the factories and also in other conspicuous places. Safety slogans may also be displayed.

- 2) Safety Talk may be delivered to the factory workers by the Occupier / Manager or Supervisor specially on 4<sup>th</sup> March, 2025 about the needs of Safety in factories, observance of safety requirement and use of personal protective equipments etc. besides, group meetings, exhibitions, safety demonstrations, Essay/slogan/ Posters/ Drawings/House Keeping/Safety Performance competition, Training Programs/Workshops/Seminars, etc. may also be organised during the Week.
- 3) Screening of Safety Films.
- 4) Practical demonstrations on PPEs, Fire Fighting, First -aids
- 5) Organising Emergency Drills
- 6) Ensuring compliance of all safety requirements as per the provisions of the Factories Act, Boilers Act and rules made there under.
- 7) Holding Award Functions.

Details of celebration programmes from individual factory may please be intimated to this office by **15<sup>th</sup> March, 2025** positively for sending information to the Government of India.
